








	VIRGINIA CODE §18.2-369	 § 18.2-369. Abuse and neglect of incapacitated adults; penalty. A. It shall be unlawful for any responsible person to abuse or neglect any incapacitated adult as defined in this section.

	 Prohibits abuse and neglect of incapacitated adults, not <i>elderly</i> adults Differences from incapacitated victims in the financial exploitation
§18.2-369	statute – physical or mental incapacity
	Requires defendant be responsible for care
	 Similar to Child Abuse/Neglect statute (§18.2-371.1)

	"Responsible person" means:
RESPONSIBLE PERSON	• a person who has responsibility for the care, custody or control of an incapacitated person by operation of law ,
	OR
	• who has assumed such responsibility voluntarily, by contract or in fact.

	Abuse:
	• Causes physical injury or pain
ABUSE	OR
	 Knowing and willful use of physical restraint, including confinement, as punishment, for convenience or as substitute for treatment
	• (Includes chemical restraints)



	Neglect:
	• Knowing and willful failure
NEGLECT	• By responsible person
	• To provide treatment, care, goods or services
	 Results in injury or endangers safety



	INCAPACITATED ADULT	 "Incapacitated adult" means any person 18 years of age or older who is impaired by reason of mental illness, intellectual disability, physical illness or disability, advanced age or other causes
		• to the extent the adult lacks sufficient understanding or capacity to make, communicate or carry out reasonable decisions concerning their well-being.

KNOWING AND WILLFUL	 A willful act is one done with a bad purpose, or without justifiable excuse, or without ground for believing it is lawful. A willful act is intentional, or knowing, or voluntary, as distinguished from accidental.
	• The terms "bad purpose" or "without justifiable excuse" require knowledge that the particular conduct will likely result in injury or illegality.



No responsible person shall be in violation of this section whose conduct was: (i) in accordance with the informed consent of the incapacitated person or a person authorized to consent on his behalf;

(ii) in accordance with a declaration by the incapacitated person under the Health Care Decisions Act (§ 54.1-2981 et seq.) or with the provisions of a valid

(iii) in accordance with the wishes of the incapacitated person or a person authorized to consent on behalf of the incapacitated person and in accord with the tenets and practices of a church or religious denomination;

(iv) incident to necessary movement of, placement of or protection from harm to the incapacitated person; or

(v) a bona fide, recognized or approved practice to provide medical care.


C.The local department . . . shall immediately refer the matter and all relevant documentation to the local law-enforcement agency upon receipt of an initial report pursuant to § 63.2-1606 involving any of the following :


Sexual abuse as defined in <u>18.2-67 10</u>;
 Death, serious bodily injury or disease as defined in <u>18.2-369</u> that is believed to be the result of abuse or neglect; or


3.Any other criminal activity involving abuse or neglect that places the adult in imminent danger of death or serious bodily harm.


4. Suspected financial exploitation of an adult;

No serious injury or disease = Class I misdemeanor
2 nd offense = Class 6 felony
Serious injury or disease = Class 4 felony
Death = Class 3 felony





























HOW CAN ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES ASSIST?	APS may enter premises with law enforcement officers and remove adult from premises (if incapacitated) If caregiver or guardian is present, their consent is required, unless the APS investigator suspects the caregiver may have caused the abuse or neglect May petition for court order authorizing protective services







	WHAT IS UNDUE INFLUENCE?	 Method used by perpetrator to obtain false or forced "consent" from victim in order to commit crime of theft. Substitution of perpetrator's will for the true desires of victim – similar to brainwashing. Victim consents to transactions based on what perpetrator wants – not in victim's best interest. Includes fraud, duress, threats, or other deceits

Undue influence is any abuse of a close or professional relationship by any means that overcomes the free will of another person and induces him to do what he otherwise would not have done. If a party entered into a contract as a result of undue influence, then the contract cannot be enforced against him.








§ 18.2-178.1 FINANCIAL EXPLOITATION OF MENTALLY INCAPACITATED PERSONS	A. It is unlawful for any person who knows or should know that another person suffers from mental incapacity to, through the use of that other person's mental incapacity, take, obtain, or convert money or other thing of value belonging to that other person with the intent to permanently deprive him thereof. Any person who violates this section shall be deemed guilty of larceny. (For offenses after July 1, 2013)

In satisfying this standard, the trustee shall exercise reasonable care, skill, and caution.

	invest and manage the trust assets solely in the interest of the beneficiaries.	








DEMENTIA





TRAUMA INTERVIEW OF ELDERLY	Speak directly to the person rather than to his or her caregiver or companion. Take time to listen to the person express his or her thoughts, feelings and needs. Give the person time to respond. Don't interrupt unless help is requested. Ask what the person is still comfortable doing and what he or she may need help with. Its OK to laugh. Humor lightens the mood and makes communication easier.














VIRGINIA TRIAD RESOURCES
